



Shandong wind power, China

A wind farm in South-Eastern China is contributing to the further development of renewable energy generation, mitigating climate change and the country's dependence on fossil fuels.

Location



This wind energy project is located in Shandong province, on the eastern edge of the North China Plain at the shores of the Yellow Sea.

Project



The project consists of two wind farms, located in Zeku and Houjia, respectively. In total, 66 wind turbines have been built with a total installed capacity of about 50MW.

Apart from carbon emission reduction, the project has brought several benefits to the local population. During construction, fixed-contract positions were created, and the regional economy has benefited from the procurement of services and equipment such as cables, masts and transformers, turbine blades and general construction materials.

The project establishes an important benchmark in Shandong, that aims to exceed the National Plan on the introduction of wind energy.
