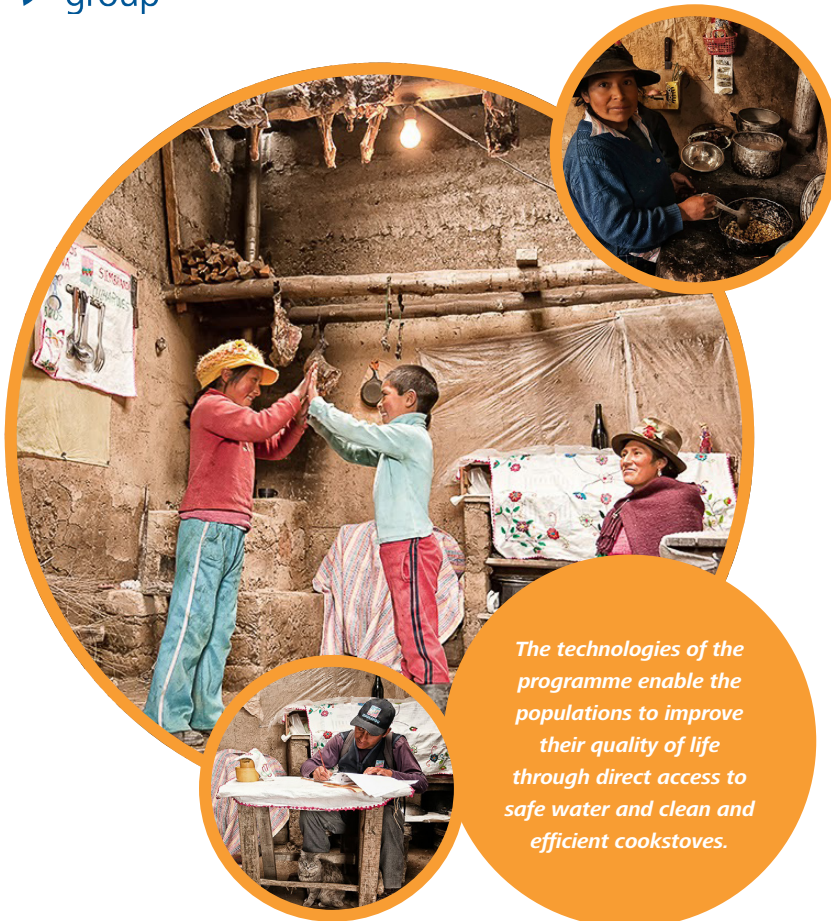




UTSIL NAJ - HEALTHY HOMES FOR ALL LATIN AMERICA

Improving living conditions across Latin America

The Utsil Naj large-scale programme has been designed as a multi-technology programme of activities for Latin America. It aims to disseminate technologies with strong social impacts to poor populations of Mexico, Guatemala, Honduras, and El Salvador in order to improve their living conditions in a sustainable way.



The technologies of the programme enable the populations to improve their quality of life through direct access to safe water and clean and efficient cookstoves.

Ustil Naj currently comprises 11 project developers in four countries: Mexico, Guatemala, Honduras, and El Salvador. The programme includes technologies such as water filters and improved cookstoves. To date, the programme has installed more than 26,000 improved cookstoves, benefiting about 100,000 people living in poverty.

Project impacts include health, social, environmental and economic benefits. For instance, the improved cookstoves contribute to the empowerment of women, allowing them to cook more quickly, reducing the burden of procuring wood and freeing up time for the education of children.

These stoves are also more efficient, therefore reducing CO₂ emissions and helping to decrease deforestation. The water filter enables the population to have direct access to safe water.
